Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT) for Substance Use Disorders: An Overview of Medications and the DATA Waiver Process

This educational session will review the pathological process associated with substance use disorders in women, and the role of women's health providers in identifying and facilitating treatment. Common MAT medications used to treat substance use disorders will be discussed, including indications and adverse effects. The session will provide an overview of the process of applying for a DATA waiver (from SAMHSA) for qualified advanced practice nurses to be able to prescribe buprenorphine in an office-based setting.
